



General Information

The Great Basin Challenge is being held in conjunction with the Tri-County Fair and Stampede on Saturday, September 2 and Sunday, September 3. Event dates and times are listed below. This event is open to young buckaroos between the ages of 2 and 15. Boys and girls will compete against each other in Stick Horse Barrel Racing, Dummy Roping, Mutton Bustin', Calf Riding and Junior Barrel Racing. Silver Buckles will be given to first place winners in each event and each age group. The top 6 in Mutton Bustin', top 4 in Calf Riding (both age groups) and top 5 in the Junior Barrel Racing will compete in the Bulls and Broncs Rodeo on Saturday at 5:00 p.m. in the Main Outdoor Arena. The contestants competing at 5:00 p.m. will be given one complimentary child and one complimentary adult ticket to the Bulls and Broncs Rodeo. Contestants must wear complete western attire for the 5:00 p.m. performance.

Rules: Contestants in the Stick Horse Barrels, Junior Barrels and Dummy Roping will be timed for awards. Junior Barrel Racers must be able to ride a horse without assistance. Mutton Busters and Calf Riders must ride for 6 seconds. If the rider falls off before the whistle is blown, the rider will be timed for awards. The winner will be determined by highest score. If no one scores, the winner will be the one who stayed on the longest. Contestants must be ready to ride when their name is called. If contestant fails to ride within 2 minutes, animal will be turned-out. The Rodeo Committee strongly suggests contestants wear helmet and safety equipment in rough stock events. Contestants must provide their own equipment.

Mutton Bustin' - No Spurs! No Ropes Allowed, No Riding Backwards. Officials decisions are final.
